An Analysis of Slang Words of Song Lyrics in the Album “Emails I Can’t Send” by Sabrina Carpenter

Slang Word; Word Formation; Song Lyrics	This research is entitled An Analysis of Slang Words of Song Lyrics in the Album by Sabrina Carpenter. This research aims to determine the types and meaning of slang word formation which are manifested in the formation of slang words in Sabrina Carpenter' album, 'Emails I Can't Send'. A qualitative descriptive method based on Yule's (2017) theory was used in this research. Data collection involved documenting 13 song lyrics from Sabrina Carpenter albums. This research found that there were seven types of slang word formation in the data: blending, clipping, derivation, coinage, compounding, borrowing, and multiple process. Blending emerged as the most dominant type, accounting for 41% of all events, followed by clipping (30%), derivation (14%), coinage (6%), compounding (5%), borrowing (3%) and multiple process (1%). Meaning slang word of this album dominan make blending that is the process of combining two or more words into a new word. These slang word are used in albums to convey emotion, establish rhythmic patterns, and inspire songs.
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INTRODUCTION

Language in social is a language used by society as a communication tool to facilitate interaction with others (Usman et al., 2020). Language was a tool humans used to interact with one another. It was a divine gift that we should be thankful for. Language played a crucial role as it was our means of communication (Kurniati et al., 2024). Human existence, characterized as zoon political or social beings, typically unfolds within the framework of communities, societal groups, states, and the international community. The ability to live and sustain life is inherently reliant on mutual assistance. Individuals depend on one another to meet their daily needs and desires, necessitating the use of language as a means of communication. Those

who successfully navigate societal dynamics are individuals capable of establishing meaningful relationships through effective communication.

Language is a device for people to talk or communicative with others (Putri et al., 2023). Language is an image of sound tool which take a function as an important element in human lifestyles as a way conversation to bring concept, message, purpose, and opinion to other human beings (Putri et al., 2019). Linguistics became the examination of language which supplied an information of the character and all of the intricacies of language, and the way language performed its position in human lifestyles in society (Kurniati et al., 2021). In this study of language which involves social and linguistics is called sociolinguistics.

Sociolinguistics defined as a branch of study that explores the connection between language and society. Its primary purpose is to examine the intricate relationship that exists between language and societal structures (Yule, 2017). Sociolinguistics is the academic discipline that examines the interconnection between language and society, exploring the correlation between language usage and the prevailing social frameworks within which language users exist. This field of inquiry operates under the premise that human society comprises numerous interconnected patterns and behaviors, with linguistic aspects constituting a significant dimension of this broader societal fabric (Spolsky in Yudhistira & Mayasari, 2022).

Literature also explicit the opinion that the essence of literary works is that the lifestyles presented through motion at the degree is not real life, however, existence that has gone through the manner of the author's creativeness and creation or existence in keeping with the author's interpretation (Wicaksono et al., 2018). Literature is often expressed as a piece. Literary works are an expression of human expression primarily based on thoughts, opinions, stories and emotions, expressed in a written or oral paintings. There are several forms of literary works that we typically stumble upon, namely movies, novels and song or music (Aryawan, 2017).

Music is a medium for artistic expression, song displays the subculture of the helping community (Asitah et al., 2022). Song is a piece of artwork in the shape of sound inside the form of songs to particular mind and feelings via the primary factors of song, specifically rhythms, melody, harmony and the form of structure of songs and expression as a unit. Song contains values and norms which are part of the cultural enculturation technique, each in formal and casual forms. Track itself has a unique form, every from a structural point of view and its type in tradition. The shape of song in track lyrics is someone's expression about some factor they have got visible, heard or skilled. In expressing their studies, poets or songwriters play with words and language to create attraction and forte to their lyrics or poems.

Lyrics are phrases which might be prepared to form a sentence containing melody. Sentence containing this melody can be a work that can be listened to. lyrics are an indispensable (Agustina & Mustikawati, 2023). This arrangement of words is a person's expression approximately something they've got visible, heard or professional. This expressed expression will become the idea for a song to be created.

According to Yule (2017), slang used by people outside groups who have high status. Slang describes words or

phrases used to modify everyday terms between young speakers and other groups who share similar interests. Slang can take the form of words, phrases and sentences.

Slang word is a type of language variation within sociolinguistics. It consists of vocabulary employed by individuals within a shared social circle who are familiar with each other. Slang is characterized by its highly informal nature and is more commonly utilized in spoken communication than in written form. It can be potentially offensive when employed outside the context of a closely-knit group. Slang typically encompasses specific words and their meanings, but it may also encompass longer phrases and idioms (Yudhistira & Mayasari, 2022).

There were several previous studies related to this research. These studies also have the same research topic, which is analyzing slang words in a specific context. Here are some of those previous studies:

Desak Made Ewik Wiartati, I Komang Sulatra, and Ni Made Verayanti Utami (Wiartati et al., 2022) in their study entitled *Analysis of Slang Words in Song Lyrics by Megan Thee Stallion on Tina Snow Album*. The objectives of this study encompass the identification of the various categories of slang words and an exploration of the processes involved in their creation within Megan Thee Stallion's song lyrics on the Tina Snow album. To analyze the data, two distinct theories were applied. Firstly, the theory proposed by Kipfer and Chapman (2008) was used to screen the types of slang words. Second, to assess the word formation processes involved in creating slang words, the study incorporated Mattiello's theory (2008: 72-154). Employing a descriptive qualitative method, the data analysis revealed two primary types of slang present in Tina Snow's album by Megan Thee Stallion, namely, primary slang and secondary slang. Concerning the word formation process of creating slang words, the study identified five out of the 15 types of word formation processes, including compounding, conversion, acronyms and initialisms, blending, and clipping.

Hastuti Retno Kuspiyah (Kuspiyah, 2017) in her study entitled *Analysis on the Use of Slang on Eminem's Lyrics*. This research focuses on examining the utilization of slang within the lyrics of Eminem's songs. The primary objectives of this investigation include identifying the types of slang employed in Eminem's song lyrics and elucidating the meanings associated with these instances of slang within the lyrics. To achieve this, a descriptive method is employed to delineate the significance of slang language within Eminem's song lyrics. The data, consisting of lyrics from ten randomly selected songs, are subjected to a systematic procedure: (1) comprehending the lyrics; (2) identifying the slang words therein; (3) marking the

identified slang words; and (4) afterward finding and classifying the meanings attributed to these slang words. To analyze the data, researcher used theory based on Partridge theory. The study discerns five distinct types of slang present in Eminem's lyrics, encompassing cockney slang, society slang, workmen's slang, public house slang, and slang within public schools and universities.

The similarity among the three previous studies are the aims of the research, which is to analyze the type of slang word. While the difference of the two previous studies are the tittle of the song and the theory that used in each studies.

1. The first previous study used the Kipfer Chapman Theory and Mattiello's theory (2008: 72-154).
2. The second previous study used the Partridge theory.

In this research, researchers analyze the slang words contained in lyrics of the song in the album *Emails I Can't Send* by Sabrina Carpenter. This research aims to determine the types and meaning of slang word formation which are manifested in the formation of slang words in Sabrina Carpenter's album, 'Emails I Can't Send'. In the research use the main theory by Yule theory (Yule, 2017), that states that there were 11 types of slang word forms. There were Coinage, Borrowing, Compounding, Blending, Clipping, Blackformation, Conversation, Acronyms, Derivation, Prefixes and Suffixes, Infixes, and Multiple Process.

The researchers chosen the album "Emails I Can't Send" as a data source, because the song lyrics in this album attract music lovers and there were many slang words found in the song lyrics. There were advantages this album debuted at number 23 on the US Billboard 200 chart, with 18,000 album equivalent units earned, consisting of 7,000 pure album copies, making the album Carpenter's highest entry on the chart, and also at number 55 on the Canadian Albums Chart, her second and highest entry on the chart. The album "Emails I Can't Send" by Sabrina Carpenter highlights the use of slang words as the main element in conveying personal narratives, emotions, and interpersonal experiences.

From the statement above, the researchers conducted a study "An Analysis of Slang Words of Song Lyrics in the Album 'Emails I Can't Send' By Sabrina Carpenter".

METHOD

Educational research is the application of the clinical approach to the look at of educational troubles. Academic studies is the way wherein human beings acquire dependable and useful records approximately the educative method. educational research is typically classified into two huge categories: quantitative and qualitative studies.

Every approach has its very own method and terminology. Quantitative studies uses objective dimension to acquire numeric information that are used to answer questions or check predetermined hypotheses. It commonly requires a properly-managed setting. Qualitative studies, in evaluation, specializes in understanding social phenomena from the angle of the human members in natural settings. It does not begin with formal hypotheses, but it is able to result in hypotheses as the look at unfolds (Ary et al., 2009).

The researchers chosen a descriptive qualitative method to delve into the examination, evaluation, and identification of slang phrases in Sabrina wood worker's tune. The data for this research is descriptively analyzed, relying on transcripts of the song lyrics from the album "emails I can't send." The methodology involves the researcher meticulously collecting and reading the facts phrase by way of phrase. Tools like text evaluation software and dictionaries are used as resources to assist writers in accurately identifying information.

The researchers used the transcription of this song as a main source, the source of information is the lyrics of Sabrina Carpenter's album "Emails I can't send".

In collecting data, the researcher listened and used song lyrics in the album 'Emails I Can't Send' by Sabrina Carpenter as a data source. The methods used for data collection in this research as follows: Reading and understanding words, underlining the slang words in the lyrics, coding, identifying the slang words used in the lyrics, finding and classify the meaning of the slang words, and collecting the data.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

In the song lyrics by Sabrina Carpenter there were many slangs used in the lyrics have characteristic of slang word such as (word, phrase, and sentence) that made. The researcher analyzed the data from collecting some song lyrics by Sabrina Carpenter in internet. After analyzing the data, the researcher found many slang words formation like gonna, gotta, fuckin', tryna, and so on.

The information mentioned above was presented within the lyrics. The researchers organized and classified the data according to Yule's theory (Yule, 2017). Below some the data found in the lyrics.

After analyzing the data, this study found seven types slang word. They were coinage, blending, clipping, derivation, compounding, borrowing, and. multiple process. After collecting slang word in lyrics, the researcher summarizes the data into a table.

Based on discussion of slang words that were used in selected song lyric in album "Emails I Can't Send" by Sabrina Carpenter, there were 83 data collected in this analysis. From these data, blending is type of word formation that mostly used in song lyric on album "Emails I Can't Send" by Sabrina Carpenter, it was 34 words. After that, there was clipping has 25 words. Then, derivation has 12 words, coinage has 5 words, compounding has 4 words, borrowing has 2 words, and the last, multiple process has 1 word. It shows that from 83 data of word formation in song lyric on album "Emails I Can't Send" by Sabrina Carpenter, blending is type of word formation that mostly used it is about 40%. After that clipping is the second type of word formation that mostly used with the percentage of 30%. Then, derivation with the percentage of 14%, coinage with the percentage of 6%, compounding was 5%, borrowing 3%, and multiple process is 1%.

From the result, the explanation of types of slang word formation found in song lyrics in Emails I Can't Send album were presented below.

1. Coinage

Coinage is forming a new phrase this is adabted from a current phrase. It uses coinage technique type to shape the word. Based totally on the findings above, it could be seen that the track lyrics of Sabrina wood worker on "Emails I can't ship" album include slang words and a number of them use coinage process kind to shape the word. In this case, there have been a few slang there were: guy, yeah, baby, babe and hi.

- 1) The slang word "guy" means a man. Guy called coinage because guy is forming adopted form word man.
- 2) The slang word "yeah" means yes. Yeah called coinage because yeah is forming adopted from word yes.
- 3) The slang word "baby" means darling. Baby called coinage because this word is forming adopted from word darling.
- 4) The slang word "babe" means baby. Babe called coinage because the word baby is forming adopted from word darling.
- 5) The slang word "hi" means hallo. Hi called coinage because the word hi is forming adopted from word hallo.

2. Blending

Blending is the method of combining or greater words into a new phrase. Normally, it is combining the beginning of phrase and the ending of word. It uses mixing manner type to form the phrase. Based at the findings above, it could be visible that the music lyrics of Sabrina wood worker on "Emails I can't send" album incorporate slang phrases and some of them used blending manner type to form the phrase. In this case, there were some slang phrases there were: it's, there's, wanna, I'm, gonna, gotta, I've, I'll, you'll, you're, I'd, we'd, don't, can't, they'll, we'll, he's, let's, wasn't, we've, couldn't, won't, kinda, you'd. must've, here's, sun's, aren't, it'd, didn't, doesn't, why'd, shoulda, and tryna.

- 6) The slang word "it,s" has a short meaning from it is. It's called blending beacause this word has a combination word between it and is.
- 7) The slang word "there's" has a short meaning from there is. There's called blending because the word has a combination word between there and is.
- 8) The slang word "wanna" has a short meaning from want to. Wanna called blending because the word has a combination word between want and to.

- 9) The slang word "I'm" has a short meaning from I am. I'm called blending because the word has a combination word between I and am
- 10) The slang word "gonna" has a short meaning from going to. Gonna called blending because the word has a combination word between going and to.
- 11) The slang word "gotta" has a short meaning from got to. Gotta called blending because the word has a combination word between got and to.
- 12) The slang word "I've" has a short meaning from I have. I've called blending because the word has a combination word between I and have.
- 13) The slang word "I'll" has a short meaning from I will. I'll called blending because the word has a combination word between I and will.
- 14) The slang word "you'll" has a short meaning from you will. You'll called blending because the word has a combination word between you and will.
- 15) The slang word "you're" has a short meaning from you are. you're called blending because the word has a combination word between you and are.
- 16) The slang word "I'd" has a short meaning from I would or I had. I'd called blending because the word has a combination word between I and would or I and had.
- 17) The slang word "we'd" has a short meaning from we would or we had. We'd called blending because the word has a combination word between we and would or we and had.
- 18) The slang word "don't" has a short meaning from do not. Don't called blending because the word has a combination word between do and not.
- 19) The slang word "can't" has a short meaning from can not. Can't called blending because the word has a combination word between can and not.
- 20) The slang word "they'll" has a short meaning from they will. They'll called blending because the word has a combination word between they and will.
- 21) The slang word "we'll" has a short meaning from we will. We'll called blending because the word has a combination word between we and will.

- 34) The slang word "it'd" has a short meaning from it would or it had. It'd called blending because the word has a combination word between it and would or it and had.
- 35) The slang word "didn't" has a short meaning from did not. Didn't called blending because the word has a combination word between did and not.
- 36) The slang word "doesn't" has a short meaning from does not. Doesn't called blending because the word has a combination word between does and not.
- 37) The slang word "why'd" has a short meaning from why would or why had. Why'd called blending because the word has a combination word between why and would or why and had.
- 38) The slang word "shoulda" has a short meaning from should have. Shoulda called blending because the word has a combination word between should and have.
- 39) The slang word "tryna" has a short meaning from trying to. Tryna called blending because the word has a combination word between trying and to.

3. Clipping

Clipping is the method of shortening the word. It uses clipping method kind to shape the word. Based at the findings above, it could be seen that the music lyrics of Sabrina chippie on “Emails I can’t send” album include slang phrases and a number of them used clipping system type to shape the phrase. In this situation, there were some slang words there were: cuss, ‘cause, actin’, listenin’, decompressin’, stressin’, feellin’, crossin’, wastin’, laughin’, guessin’, arc, gettin’, ‘round, talkin’, ‘bout, fuckin’, hidin’, holdin’, reminiscin’, ‘em,, lil’, lookin’, thinkin’, picturin’, and contemplatin’.

- 40) The slang word “cuss” is a slang term derived from the word “because”. Cuss called clipping because it delete of some components of longer word become shorter form in the same which means.
- 41) The slang word “‘cause” is a slang term derived from the word “because”. ‘cause called clipping because it delete of some components of longer word become shorter form in the same which means.
- 42) The slang word “actin’” is a slang term derived from the word “acting”. Actin’ called clipping because it delete of some components of longer word become shorter form in the same which means.
- 43) The slang word “listenin’” is a slang term derived from the word “listening”. Listenin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 44) The slang word “decompressin’” is a slang term derived from the word “decompressing”. Decompressin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 45) The slang word “stressin’” is a slang term derived from the word “stressing”. Stressin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 46) The slang word “feelin’” is a slang term derived from the word “feeling”. Feelin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 47) The slang word “crossin’” is a slang term derived from the word “crossing”. Crossin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 48) The slang word “wastin’” is a slang term derived from the word “wasting”. Wastin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 49) The slang word “laughin’” is a slang term derived from the word “laughing”. Laughin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.

- 50) The slang word “guessin’” is slang term derived from the word “guessing”. Guessin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 51) The slang word “arc” is slang term derived from the word “archive”. Arc called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 52) The slang word “gettin’” is a slang term derived from the word “getting”. Gettin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 53) The slang word “‘round” is a slang term derived from the word “around”. ‘round called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 54) The slang word “talkin’” is a slang term derived from the word “talking”. Talkin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 55) The slang word “‘bout” is a slang term derived from the word “about”. ‘bout called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 56) The slang word “hidin’” is a slang term derived from the word “hiding”. Hidin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 57) The slang word “holdin’” is a slang term derived from the word “holding”. Holdin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 58) The slang word “reminiscin’” is a slang term derived from the word “reminiscing”. Reminiscin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 59) The slang word “‘em” is a slang term derived from the word “them”. ‘Em called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 60) The slang word “‘lil” is a slang term derived from the word “little”. ‘lil called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 61) The slang word “lookin’” is a slang term from the word “looking”. Lookin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 62) The slang word “thinkin’” is a slang term from the word “thinking”. Thinkin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.
- 63) The slang word “picturin’” is a slang term from the word “picturing”. Picturin’ called clipping

because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.

- 64) The slang word “contemplatin” is a slang term from the word “contemplating”. Contemplatin’ called clipping because it delete of some parts of longer word become shorter form in the same meaning.

4. Derivation

Derivation is the process of forming new words in a language through adding affixes (prefixes, suffixes, infixes, or confixes) to basic words or word roots. This process changes the meaning or grammatical category of the word. The faktor is un-, miss-, pre-, full-, less-, etc. Based on the findings, it can be seen that the song lyrics of Sabrina Carpenter on “Emails I Can’t Send” album contain slang words and some of them used derivation process type to form the word. In this case, there were some slang words there were: selfish, insecure, relationship, innocent, rebound, recommend, selfishly, rewrites, resistant, reread, nonsense and unpacked.

- 65) The slang word “selfish” has meaning self-centered or egoistic. Selfish called derivation because formed by adding the suffix “-ish” to the basic word “self” and forming a new word, namely selfish.
- 66) The slang word “insecure” has meaning not confident. Insecure called derivation because the word “scure” got prefix “in” and forming a new word, namely insecure.
- 67) The slang word “relationship” has meaning connected of boyfriend and girlfriend. Relationship called derivation because the word “relate” got suffix “-ion” and “-ship” and forming a new word, namely relationship.
- 68) The slang word “innocent” has meaning not guilty. Innocent called derivation because the basic word “nocere” got prefix “in” and forming a new word, namely “innocent”.
- 69) The slang word “rebound” has meaning recovery relationship. Rebound called derivation because the basic word “bound” got prefix “re” and forming a new word namely, rebound.
- 70) The slang word “recommend” has meaning. Recommend called derivation because the basic word “commend” got prefix “re” and forming a new word, namely recommend.
- 71) The slang word “selfishly” has meaning self-centeredly. Selfishly called derivation because the basic word “self” got suffix “-ish” and “-ly” and forming a new word, namely selfishly.
- 72) The slang word “rewrites” has meaning write in reply. Rewrites called derivation because the basic word “write” got prefix “re” and suffix “s” and forming a new word namely, rewrites.

- 73) The slang word “resistant” has meaning to be immune or impervious to something. Resistant called derivation because the basic word “resist” got suffix “-ant” and forming a new word, namely resistant.
- 74) The slang word “reread” has meaning read again. Reread called derivation because the basic word “read” got prefix “re” and forming the word reread.
- 75) The slang word “nonsense” has meaning words or ideas that are foolish or untrue. Nonsense called derivation because the basic word “sense” got prefix “non” and forming a new word, namely nonsense.
- 76) The slang word “unpacked” has meaning not packed or break down something. Unpacked called derivation because the basic word “pack” got prefix “un-” and suffix “-ed” and forming a new word, namely unpacked.

5. Compounding

Compounding is combining two sentence to form a single entity. Based on the findings, it can be seen that the song lyrics of Sabrina Carpenter on “Emails I Can’t Send” album contain slang words and some of them used compounding process type to form the word. In this case, there were some slang words there were: homewrecker, well-established, daylight, and undertone.

- 77) The slang word “homewrecker” has meaning some who is responsible for breaking up a marriage or relationship. Homewrecker called compounding because it is formed by combining two independent words, “home” and “wrecker,” to create a new term with a distinct meaning.
- 78) The slang word “well-established” has meaning it was patented. Well-established called compounding because it combining two words “well” and “established” to create a single descriptive term with a specific and cohesive meaning.
- 79) The slang word “daylight” has meaning midday. Daylight called compounding because it is formed by combining two separate words, “day” and “light,” to create a new word with its own distinct meaning.
- 80) The slang word “undertone” has meaning a low or quiet voice. Undertone called compounding because it is created by combining two separate words, “under” and “tone,” to form a new word with its own unique meaning.

6. Borrowing

Borrowing is a linguistic process in which one language takes words from another language. Based on the findings, it can be seen that the song lyrics of Sabrina Carpenter on

“Emails I Can’t Send” album contain slang words and some of them used borrowing type to form the words. In this case, there were slang words there were: resist, and remorse.

- 81) Resist means to stand against. Resist called borrowing because it was adopted into English from another language, in this case, Latin through Old French. It originated from the Latin word "resistere" (to withstand).
- 82) Remorse means deep regret or guilt for a wrong committed. The word "remorse" comes from the Latin word "remorsus," which is the past tense of "remordere," meaning "to bite again" or "to torment."

7. Multiple Process

Multiple process is feasible for a phrase go through a couple of process. Based totally at the findings, it is able to be seen that the track lyrics of Sabrina chippie on “Emails I can’t send” album comprise slang phrases and some of them used multiple manner kind to shape the phrase. In this case, there was slang phrases there was: double-checkin’. The slang word “double-checkin’” has meaning recheck. Double-checkin’ called Multiple process because it combines two main processes: compounding and clipping. First, “double-checkin’” is combining two words “double” and “checkin’”. Second, “checkin’” is short for word “checking”.

CONCLUSION

Based on the findings and discussion in the previous chapter, the researcher can conclude that there were 83 slang words and phases that occur in the thirteen song lyrics by Sabrina Carpenter. The researcher found 83 data slang words and seven types of eleven slang’s types based yule’s theory. There were blending, clipping, coinage, compounding, derivation, borrowing, and multiple process.

Based on analysis of the data above, blending was the slang word that most often used in this song. Because in this song many uses a lot of combining words with different morphemes to shorten word and become new words. Blending is the process of combining two or more words into a new word. Usually, it is combining the beginning of word and the ending of word. From this meaning, data that often appear are typically formed by combining an auxiliary verb and a main verb, or a pronoun and a verb, often with an apostrophe replacing the omitted letters. There were: don’t means do not, wanna means want to, tryna means trying to, kinda means kind of, etc.

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
